



Second Circular

- 1. <u>Invitation</u>. The National Hydrographic Office, Dehradun, India, has the honour of inviting all the professionals interested in the field of Cartography/GIS and allied subjects as well as various disciplines of their application viz. Geography, Geology, Geophysics, Oceanography, Geo- informatics, Artificial intelligence, Hydro-meteorology, Marine Geomorphology, Coastal Resource Management and Environmental Planning etc. to participate in the forthcoming 42ndInternational Congress of Indian National Cartographic Association (INCA), being held at Dehradun, Uttarakhand, during **09-11 November 2022**.
- 2. <u>The Congress</u>. Indian National Cartographic Association (INCA) is an inter-disciplinary institution originally between Geographers and Cartographers which is now shared by a host of premier public and private bodies. Since its inception, Cartography in India has seen many changes. Re-christened since then as GIS or Geoinformatics, it is today a multifaceted and highly composite broad subject, rolling several disciplines and multi-dimensional association, which was established in 1979 at Hyderabad as its headquarters, with the following aims:-
 - (a) To foster cartographic research in the country.
 - (b) To co-operate with professional organisations of cognate disciplines and to promote interaction within an inter-disciplinary frame.
 - (c) To co-operate with International organisations with similar objectives.
 - (d) To foster co-operation between government and quasi government organisations, research institutions engaged in cartographic activities and their application.
 - (e) To hold an annual cartographic congress at the national or international level.
 - (f) To take such measures as may help secure cartography its legitimate place in national life and enhance a sense of national responsibility and professional efficacy among all the professionals and academic people engaged in cartographic activities in its broad sense.
- 3. <u>The Host</u>. The National Hydrographic Office (NHO) is a specialised branch of the Indian Navy functions under the Chief Hydrographer to the Government of India. The

Organisation is a direct descendant of Marine Survey of India founded in 1874 by the British with its office at Kolkata. This Office at its present location in Dehradun was established in 1954 which has been renamed as the "National Hydrographic Office" (NHO) in 1997. NHO is the national authority for publication of navigational charts and publications essentially required for safe navigation of ships. The NHO provides reliable and updated information for safety of navigation at sea as per SOLAS regulations and for the exploration and exploitation of natural resources/projects of economic importance at sea through detailed surveys and research programmes. It interacts with various agencies at National/International level in the field of Hydrography and Oceanography including Coastal Zone Management, environmental protection, on norms laid down by International Hydrographic Organization (IHO). The field surveys are executed by seven Ocean going surveying ships fully fitted with state of the art equipment. Data collected by the ships are thoroughly examined by the experienced Hydrographers/Cartographers at the Dehradun office and published as navigational paper and electronic charts and allied publications meeting the specified IHO standards for use by the sea going community.

4. **Focal Theme**. The theme for 42nd INCA International Congress is:

"Digital Cartography to Harness Blue Economy"

- 5. <u>Sub-Theme</u>. The deliberation of the congress will be divided into the following sub-themes:
 - (a) Trending Cartography Past, Present and Future
 - (b) Modern Precision Surveying & Mapping Tool
 - (c) Geospatial Solution for Sustainable Water Resource Management
 - (d) Hydrographic Surveys and Mapping for Coastal Zone Management
 - (e) GIS Application for Climate Change and Environmental Studies
 - (f) Mapping Solutions for Risk Assessment, Mitigation Measures and Disaster Management
 - (g) Application of Artificial Intelligence tools for Urban Planning and Resource Management

6. Call for Papers. Technical research papers/case studies are invited from professionals/ scientists, academicians and research students in the field of Cartography, Marine Geology & Geomorphology, Hydrology, Marine Geography, Geophysics, Oceanography, Environmental Science, Meteorology and various marine survey departments. Abstract not exceeding 250 words and full paper not exceeding 10 pages should be typed neatly on A4 size paper in MS Word with 12 font, in Times New Roman. Digital Copy maybe uploaded online through website www.42inca.org as well as mail at info@42inca.org. Authors are requested to provide their complete contact address with telephone number, Fax and E-mail on both abstract and full paper. All abstracts (and full papers) should be provided with a foot note indicating the sub-theme for which the paper is to be considered.

7. Poster Presentation Guidelines.

The Poster Size should be limited to **A0 paper size**. Boards will be provided for posters at appropriate places. The Posters should be visually attractive and eye catching. Maps and figures must be in finished form and readable preferably in font 20 or higher. Posters must be ready to be placed at the beginning of the Congress.

8. **Endowment Lectures**.

During the Congress, two prestigious Endowment lectures namely **Todar Mal** and **S.P.Chaterjee Memorial Lectures** will be delivered by eminent professionals in mapping field.

- 14. <u>Exhibition</u>. An exhibition of maps, charts, globes, models and cartographic, reprographic, surveying, remote sensing related latest equipment will be organised during the congress at the venue, to encourage interested companies to show case their products and services. 17. **General Information**.

- (a) About Dehradun. Dehradun, the capital of the Uttarakhand is visited by a large number of tourist every year, many of them en-route to Mussoorie. Nestled in the gorgeous mountain ranges of the Himalayas, the climate of the city is temperate even during summers. Dehradun is one of the fast emerging modern cities in Northern India. The city boasts of many National Institutes like the Forest Research Institute (FRI), Indian Institute of Remote Sensing (IIRS), Rashtriya Indian Military College (RIMC), and the Indian Military Academy (IMA) besides a host of prestigious public schools. Dehradun has been one of the best known educational centres in Northern India. The city is well connected by road, rail and air. A few of the prominent locales around Dehradun are:
- (b) <u>Mussoorie</u>. The Queen of Hills, is located about 28 Kms from Dehradun and amongst the most popular hill stations in India. It's a leisure traveller's and honeymooner's paradise that captivates the onlookers. A perfect summer resort and a

major educational and cultural centre rolled into one hub. Places to see in Mussoorie include the Gun Hill, Mall Road, Mussoorie Lake, Landour, Camel's Back Road, Laltibba, Sir George Everest House, Tibetan Temple, Municipal Gardens/Company Bagh and Kempty Fall.

- (c) <u>Rishikesh</u>. The pilgrimage town of **Rishikesh** is about 40 Kms from Dehradun. Rishikesh is also considered as the Gateway to the Himalayas. The Char DhamYatra (Four Shrines sacred journey) generally begins from Rishikesh.
- (d) <u>Haridwar</u>. About 50 Kms from Dehradun is one of the most ancient pilgrimage centres in India that has been held in reverence from time immemorial. Haridwar is literally the Gateway to the Lord (Hari-Dwar). As the point of entry to Dev Bhoomi and Char Dham (the four main shrines situated in the upper reach of the Himalayas, Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri and Yamunotri in Uttarakhand) it acquires its name Haridwar.
- (e) <u>How to Reach</u>. Jolly Grant Airport in Dehradun is a domestic airport located at about 20 km away from city centre. Taxi cabs are available from the airport to city. The airport operates daily flights to Delhi. Nearest International airport is Delhi, which is about 235 km away. Dehradun is a major railway station which is connected to all cities in the country. The major cities like Delhi, Kolkata, Varanasi, Chennai, Trivandrum, Mumbai, Ujjain, Indore, are connected by express trains and superfast trains. All nearby cities are connected to Dehradun by State owned Uttarakhand transport buses. There are overnight deluxe A/C bus services of Uttarakhand Tourism from New Delhi to Dehradun. A distance of 235 km from Delhi to Dehradun costs about Rs.600 by deluxe bus. The venue for the conference is the NHO which is about 5 kms from the Dehradun railway station and 30 kms from Jolly Grant airport.
- (f) <u>Weather & Clothing.</u> Throughout the month of November, daytime temperatures will generally reach a high of around 26°C. At night the average minimum temperature drops down to around 17°C. In recent times the highest recorded temperature in November has been 33°C, with the lowest recorded temperature 9°C.

Normal cotton / light woollen clothes are suggested for the day and woollen clothes for the evenings.

- (g) <u>Help Desk.</u> A help desk will be setup at NHO for providing necessary assistance to all delegates w.r.t accommodation and transport. Delegates are requested to approach the help desk for further assistance on Mob: 9411340255 (Mr Sunil Dutt). The accommodation is subject to availability, if otherwise already not booked by them well in time.
- (g) <u>Accommodation</u>. The Period of the Conference i.e 09-11 Nov 2022 is good period as regards to weather and constitute off tourist season, but nothing can be forecasted about other scheduled events during the period of the conference. Therefore it is advised that hotels may be pre-booked. Delegates who wish to book their accommodation may contact directly with hotels.
